In a stressful moment, the right number should be easy

This PDF helps you organize emergency contacts, hotel details, insurance information, embassy/consulate notes, medicine info, and lost-phone/lost-passport actions in one printable place.

1 Fill core details

Add your name, blood type if you choose, hotel, contact person, and insurance

2 Make backups

Keep a printed copy, an offline phone copy, and one copy with someone you trust.

3 Plan loss scenarios

Know what to do if phone, passport, card, or bag goes missing.

4 Use with Voyasee

Pair this card with Scam Checker, Travel Medicine Checker, and Transit Visa Checker.

Official reminder

Passport, visa, transit, health, medicine, airline baggage, payment, and local safety rules can change. Always verify important details with official government, airline, embassy, airport, and health sources before travel.

Emergency detail priority board

What to store and why it matters.

Detail	Why it helps	Where to save
Hotel address	Taxi, police, medical staff, or helpers may need a clear location.	Phone offline file + printed copy.
Insurance number	Hospitals or clinics may ask for policy details.	Emergency card + cloud backup.
Embassy/consulate	Useful for passport loss or legal emergencies.	Destination notes + official site.
Family contact	Someone can help verify identity or make calls.	Phone + paper backup.
Medical notes	Allergies, prescriptions, and conditions can matter in care.	Small private health note.
Card issuer phone	Needed if bank card is lost or blocked.	Separate from wallet if possible.

Backup rule: store essential details in at least two places that do not depend on the same phone.



If this happens, do this first

Clear first actions reduce panic.

LOST PASSPORT

- Report to local authorities if required and contact your embassy/consulate.
- Keep passport photo/copy accessible.

LOST PHONE

- Use hotel/front desk or trusted device to contact family and lock accounts.
- Keep written hotel address and key numbers.

LOST BANK CARD

- Freeze card in app or call issuer. Use backup card/cash.
- Do not keep all cards together.

MEDICAL ISSUE

- Contact insurance emergency line and local emergency services when urgent.
- Carry medicine list and allergy notes.

Lost item action map

Different losses need different first actions.

Lost item	Immediate action	Do not do this
Passport	Secure your location, report if needed, contact embassy/consulate.	Do not travel to next country without checking rules.
Phone	Lock accounts, contact family, use offline paper backup.	Do not log in on suspicious public devices.
Wallet	Freeze cards, use backup money, file report if needed.	Do not keep PINs with cards.
Luggage	Report at airline desk before leaving airport.	Do not leave without claim reference.
Medicine	Contact doctor/insurance and check local replacement rules.	Do not buy unknown substitutes casually.

The first goal is safety and access: location, identity, money, phone, medicine.



Private safety notes to prepare

These details are useful but should be handled carefully.

MEDICAL NOTE

- Allergies, essential medicine, dosage, and doctor contact if needed.
- Keep it private but accessible.

ACCOMMODATION NOTE

- Room number, hotel phone, address in local language, nearest landmark.
- Helpful for taxi or emergency return.

MONEY BACKUP

- Backup card, small cash, and emergency reserve location.
- Separate from main wallet.

IDENTITY COPY

- Passport/ID scan and visa copy in secure offline/cloud location.
- Protect files with device security.



Emergency communication timeline

Who to contact and when.

1

First 5 minutes

Move to a safe, public, well-lit place. Breathe and check what is missing or what happened.

2

First 15 minutes

Contact hotel/front desk, trusted travel partner, or family if you need help staying calm.

3

First 30 minutes

Freeze cards, lock device, call insurance, or report urgent issues depending on the problem.

4

First 60 minutes

Contact airline, embassy/consulate, local authority, or medical provider if the issue requires documentation.

5

Before sleeping

Write case numbers, names, times, addresses, and next steps so you do not forget details.

CARD 1

- Hotel address + phone + booking name.
- Emergency contact + insurance emergency phone.

CARD 2

- Medical allergies + essential medicine + dosage.
- Nearest hospital/clinic note if you have special needs.

CARD 3

- Embassy/consulate phone + address.
- Airline phone + bank emergency phone.

CARD 4

- Backup cloud/email location for documents.
- Do not write full passwords or PINs.
